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Sources for use with Section A.

Source 1: From a speech by Gorbachev to the Conference of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, June 1988. The Conference was called by Gorbachev in order to speed up change in the Soviet Union. Here he outlines the policy of glasnost.

I would like to focus particularly on the political freedoms that enable people to express opinions on any matter. These freedoms guarantee that any problem of public interest will be discussed from every perspective, and all the pros and cons will be weighed. This will help to find the best solutions by considering all opinions and actual possibilities. In short, Comrades, what we are talking about is a new role of public opinion in the country. And there is no need to fear new ideas. 5

Now – about the personal rights of citizens. Our entire legal system is designed to guarantee the rights of citizens in their private life, home, the secrecy of telephone communication, postal and telegraph correspondence. The law must reliably protect people's privacy. 10

The assertion of personal rights and freedoms, and the expansion of democracy and glasnost in general, must proceed together with an absolute respect for the law. Democracy cannot co-exist with immoral or reckless behaviour. 15



Source 2: From an article in *Pravda Severa*, 9 September 1932. *Pravda Severa* was a regional newspaper published in the far north of Russia. Here the writer comments on the daily lives of women working in factory No. 23 in Archangel in northern Russia.

In its day-to-day work with women, the Communist Party constantly implements the instructions first given by Lenin to bring women into productive employment. It releases women from domestic slavery by freeing them from subordination and the humiliation of always being responsible for cooking and taking care of the children. But officials of the Party collective and of the factory committee and the directors of factory No. 23 still have not understood this objective. 20

Pravda Severa has repeatedly demanded that the Party collective and the factory committee and the directors of factory No. 23 make serious efforts to eliminate queues at shops and improve the work of nurseries and kindergartens. This will liberate the housewives of the factory from the obstacles that destroy the strength of women, that isolate them from production and cultural activities, and that undermine the completion of the production plan at the factory. 25

Even though two months have already passed since we raised these issues, conditions at the factory have not changed at all. Neither the Party collective nor the factory committee have done anything to improve any of these awful conditions. They have also made no effort to keep more women at work in the factory. 30

We emphatically demand that the Party collective and the factory committee immediately turn their attention to getting more women into productive employment. 35
