Wilcoxon Signed Ranks test process

- Calculate the difference between two scores by taking one from the other
- Rank the differences giving the smallest difference Rank 1

Note: do not rank any differences of 0 and when adding the number of scores, do not count those with a difference of 0, and ignore the signs when calculating the difference

- Add up the ranks for positive differences
- Add up the ranks for negative differences
- T is the figure that is the smallest when the ranks are totalled (may be positive or negative)
- N is the number of scores left, ignore those with 0 difference

- 5 Charmaine used a correlational research method to investigate the relationship between participants' attitudes towards mental health disorders and their knowledge of mental health disorders.

Participants' attitudes towards mental health disorders were assessed using a structured interview consisting of the interviewer reading out 10 statements. A five-point ranked scale (1 = strongly disagree and 5 = strongly agree with the statement) was used. The higher the total score the more positive the attitude towards mental health disorders.

Participants' knowledge of mental health disorders was assessed through 15 multiple choice questions about different mental health disorders. The total number of correct answers was recorded for each participant.

The results are shown in **Table 1**.

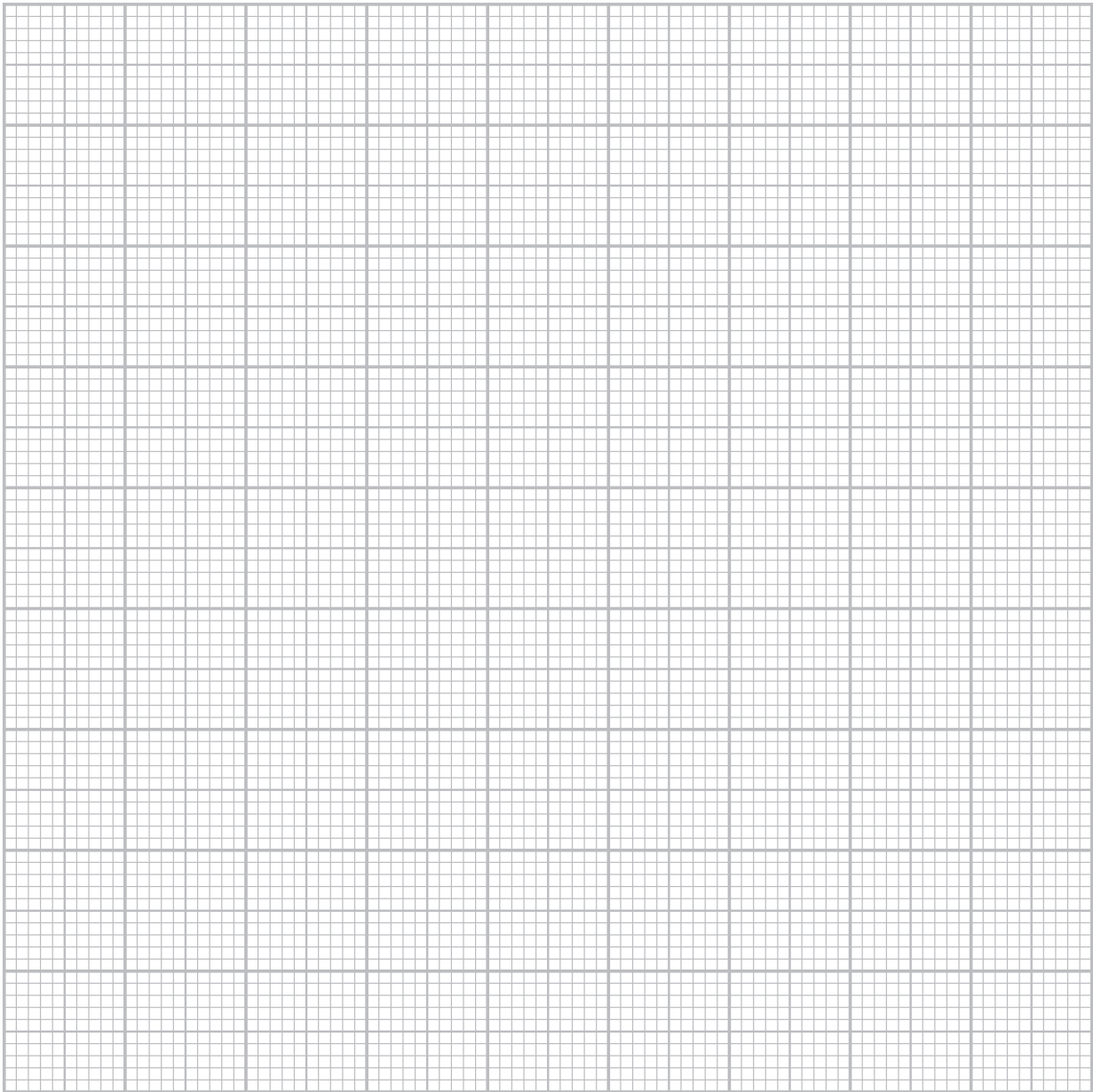

- 8** Shakima is investigating whether temperature affects performance of a memory test. She recruits 10 participants from her university psychology course.

She gives all participants 15 minutes to memorise a list of 20 words. 30 minutes later participants are given five minutes to write down all the words that they can remember.

All participants are tested twice. Condition A was completed a week before Condition B.

- **Condition A:** Tested in a room where the temperature was classed as warm.
 - **Condition B:** Tested in a room where the temperature was classed as cold.
- (a) Describe how Shakima could use a random sampling technique to gather the participants for her investigation.

- 9 D'Angelo investigated whether gender affects children's play. He recruited 15 boys and 15 girls, who were all two years old, for his investigation. Each child was tested separately at a research centre. One parent always remained with the child throughout the research task. D'Angelo observed the children playing from another room.

The same set of 10 toys were given to each child. These included: dolls, cars, balls and a toy kitchen.

D'Angelo used the same behavioural categories to observe each child for example, 'pretended to make food'. He recorded each child's behaviour every two minutes for a total of 30 minutes.

- 11 One key question for society is whether psychological knowledge can help improve academic performance in school.

Khalid et al. (2021) asked 135 students to complete four equally difficult tests. Those performing well in the first test were praised in front of the class. The second test was taken two days later. After the third test, three weeks later, those who performed poorly had to write out test questions 20 times. The fourth test was taken two days later. Students who were reinforced and punished performed better in the second and fourth test than those not given reinforcement or punishment. Reinforcement was more effective than punishment.

Al Ameer et al. (2021) investigated the use of Vygotsky's sociocultural theory to improve performance in mathematics. They found that a group of students who were taught using discussion and cooperative work with a more knowledgeable other had significantly higher marks in a mathematics test than a control group taught traditionally.

Discuss the key question of whether psychological knowledge can help improve academic performance in school. You should use concepts, theories and/or research studied in your psychology course.

- 12** In emergency situations, for example extreme weather, it is important to follow any instructions given. People may be given detailed leaflets, or shown advertisements, instructing them what to do if these emergency situations occur. People can also be directed to leave a dangerous area through the use of step-by-step verbal instructions by a person in authority.

Sometimes, however, people do not follow these instructions increasing the risk for both the person and emergency services. Psychologists have tried to understand why people do, or do not, follow the instructions given to them by others.

To what extent can cognitive and social psychology help our understanding of why people do, or do not, follow the instructions given in emergency situations?
